PADI Discover Scuba Diving Experience

Have you ever wondered what it's like to breathe underwater?

If you want to find out but aren't quite ready to take the plunge into a certification course, Discover Scuba Diving will let you try scuba to see if you like it.

While not an actual scuba certification, during the Discover Scuba Diving experience you'll learn how to use scuba equipment in shallow water and get a quick and easy introduction to what it takes to explore the underwater world.

Prerequisites

To take Discover Scuba Diving, you must be: At least 10 years old

Your Next Adventure

Duration

The **DSD** takes approx half a day to a day. It consists of 1 Theory session, 1 confined water session with 1 dive attached to it. The maximum depth allowed is 12m

PADI Scuba Diver Course

Short on time and long on the urge to become a certified diver?

The PADI Scuba Diver certification might just be for you. This course requires less time than the PADI Open Water Diver course, covering only the first three of five sections of knowledege development, the first three of five pool sessions, and the first two of four open water training dives, resulting in a limited certification. Particularly if you expect to go scuba diving primarily in the company of a dive guide or if you have limited time to devote to scuba certification, consider becoming a PADI Scuba Diver.

This certification allows for ample dive experience and is a good warm-up for the Open Water Diver course, if that's your ultimate goal.

PADI Scuba Divers are qualified to:

Dive under the direct supervision of a PADI Divemaster, Assistant Instructor or Instructor to a maximum depth of 12 metres / 40 feet

Obtain air fills, rent or purchase scuba equipment and participate in other diving activities as long as they have the required supervision

Continue their dive training and complete PADI Open Water Diver certification.

The Fun Part

The Scuba Diver certification opens the door on the underwater world for anyone who's thought that a course would take too long or be too difficult.

Upgrade to Open Water Diver whenever you want! With less time than the Scuba Diver course takes, you can make the jump to Open Water certification and start scuba diving independently whenever time allows or you're up for more



What You Learn

All the basics of scuba diving through knowledge development, a set of scuba skills in the pool that you'll use again during open water dives, and an appreciation for the underwater world that will keep you coming back for more bottom time every chance you get!

During the course you'll cover material and practice skills related to topics such as:

Buoyancy skills including comfortable ascents and descents, and breathing underwater; Staying warm underwater, streamlining your swimming skills and buddy diving techniques; diving environments and aquatic life you're likely to encounter; preventing common problems underwater; an introduction to boat diving procedures

This is a great way to get more dives under your belt while continuing to learn under the supervision of your PADI instructor.

This course builds on what you've learned and develops new capabilities by introducing you to new activities and new ways to have fun scuba diving. You'll hone your skills by completing five adventure dives that introduce you to: **Underwater Navigation; Deep Diving (up to 30 metres)** A sampler of three more Adventure Dives of your choice. **We make sure you'll get to see Dahab's Top Dive Sites!**

The Fun Part: Your Choice and Getting Dahab's best local Dive Sites!

One reason you'll love the Advanced Open Water Diver course is that you and your instructor choose from different types of Adventure Dives to complete your course. You can try your hand at night diving, peak performance buoyancy, drift diving, multilevel diving, naturalist dive, fish identification as well as boat diving and underwater photography (both supplement). **Get credit! Each Adventure Dive in the PADI Advanced Open Water Diver course may credit toward the first dive of the corresponding PADI Specialty Diver course.** You can even integrate the PADI Nitrox course into your PADI Advanced Course (supplement 99 Euro).

PADI ENRICHED AIR "NITROX" SPECIALTY

Build your bottom time, and build your confidence, as you learn that diving with enriched air isn't rocket science or difficult!

Enriched air replaces some of the nitrogen you breath underwater with oxygen, so that during a dive you absorb less nitrogen then you would when breathing normal air. This means that you have longer nodecompression limits for each depth than you do using air and are ultimately a safer diver - especially on repetitive dives.

The Fun Part

You can typically stay down longer and get back the water sooner. No wonder many divers choose this as their very first specialty.

What You Learn

Techniques for getting more dive time by using enriched air nitrox Enriched air scuba diving equipment considerations Enriched air considerations, including managing oxygen exposure, how to tell what's in your scuba tank and how to set your dive computer

Prerequisites

To enroll in the PADI Enriched Air Diver course, you must Be 15 years or older Have a PADI Open Water Diver certification (or have a qualifying certification from another organization)

Ask your PADI Instructor about how you can start your PADI Enriched Air Diver course during your PADI Open Water Diver course.

The Learning Materials You Need

The Enriched Air Diver Manual covers the procedures for diving with Enriched Air (up to 40%) using Nitrox dive computers.

Your Next Adventure

Diving with enriched air Nitrox benefits all types of diving, but it goes especially well with these specialties: PADI Underwater Photographer/ Videographer and it is a prerequisite for all Technical Diving courses.

Duration

The *Enriched Air "NITROX" Specialty Course* takes two afternoons (no dive included) and can be done on top of your normal dive package. So you won't miss a single fun dive, but gain more safety and more time in the water. The course includes 2 Nitrox tanks to be use with your dive package





PADI DEEP DIVER COURSE

After your first few scuba dives, you soon want to explore a bit deeper. There's something exciting and mysterious about the depth that attracts dives.

The Fun Part

The fun part about this course is the opportunity to explore the deep (till max 40meters). It's exhilarating.

What You Learn

Techniques for diving in the deeper range of 18-40 metres Deep scuba diving equipment considerations Experience in planning, organizing and making four deep dives under the supervision of your PADI Instructor

The Learning Materials You Need

PADI's Deep Diver crewpak (DVD and manual) provides a thorough overview of the principles and techniques needed to complete the PADI Deep Diver specialty. In addition to previewing skills you'll practice with your instructor, the materials serve as a reference guide for deep diving in a variety of conditions and environments. Is it true that ascending no faster than your bubbles is a good ascent rate?

Can a slow ascent replace a safety stop? PADI Deep Dive Specialty manual



Prerequisites

To enroll in the PADI Deep Diver course, you must Be 15 years or older

Have a PADI Adventure Diver certification (or have a qualifying certification from another organization) Your Deep Adventure Dive in the PADI Advanced Open Water Diver / Adventure Diver course credits (at your instructor's discretion) as the first dive in the PADI Deep Diver course

Your Next Adventure

Many shipwrecks are often found in deeper water. That's why the PADI Deep Diver course is a natural companion to the PADI Wreck Diver course. Sometimes you can take these two specialties concurrently. Other training to consider is the PADI Enriched Air Diver course on your way to PADI Master Scuba Diver

Duration

The *Deep Diver Specialty Course* consists of maximum 4 dives / 3 dives if your instructor credits you the Adventure deep dive.

PADI PEAK PERFORMANCE BUOYANCY COURSE

What is neutral buoyancy?

Scuba divers like to be neutrally buoyant so they neither sink nor float. It can be a tricky thing. Divers who've mastered the highest performance levels in buoyancy stand apart. You've seen them underwater. They glide effortlessly, use less air and ascend, descend or hover, almost as if by thought. They interact gently with aquatic life and affect their surroundings minimally. The PADI Peak Performance Buoyancy course refines the basic skills you learned as a PADI Open Water Diver and elevates them to the next level.



The Fun Part

The fun part of this course is giving your dive skills a polish you may not have thought possible.

What You Learn

How to trim your scuba gear so you're perfectly balanced in the water Nuances in determining weight so you're not too light nor too heavy by even a slight degree How to streamline to save air and move smoothly through the water How to hover effortlessly in both a vertical position and a horizontal position

The Learning Materials You Need

The PADI PPB DVD and the PADI PPB Specialty manual

Prerequisites

To enroll in the PADI Peak Performance Diver course, you must Have a PADI Open Water Diver certification (or have a qualifying certification from another organization) Your Peak Performance Buoyancy Adventure Dive in the PADI Advanced Open Water / Adventure Diver course credits (at your instructor's discretion) as the first dive in the PADI Peak Performance Buoyancy course.

Your Next Adventure

Part of mastering buoyancy control is learning how to use your BCD and weight system effectively, plus maintain streamlining. This makes the PADI Equipment Specialist course a natural companion, because you learn more about these pieces of gear and how to make them suit your specific diving styles.

Duration

The *Peak Performance Buoyancy Course* consists of maximum 2 dives / 1 dive if your instructor credits you the Adventure PPB dive

PADI Sidemount Specialty Course

The Fun Part

Sidemount diving is not a new concept, but its application has spread from cave diving to open water recreational and technical diving. Sidemount presents divers with a different approach to equipment configuration, and a new set of skills to master, providing an introduction to the use, benefits and proper configuration of sidemount equipment for recreational diving, with an emphasis on safety.

What You Learn

The goal of the course is to provide a systematic, methodical, approach to recreational sidemount diving, showing how to apply the skills developed using conventional backmounted equipment. It is important to note that this course does not train the diver to become a cave / cavern diver, and that, as with any other PADI course, to train the diver to dive in conditions similar to the conditions the training has been conducted.

Advantages of sidemount diving include:

-kitting up in the water so therefore less weight on your back walking in and out of the water -any equipment issues such as free flow regulator, then the valve is within easy reach to shut the cylinder down

-plenty of redundancy air

-can be used as a stepping stone into technical diving, already teaching the diver about gas management

Duration

The course consists of 4 dives in total: 1 confined + 3 opew water, so making it a 2 day course, no exams, just knowledge reviews to complete.

PADI NATURALIST DIVER COURES

Look closer to see more on your next dive.

Look for symbioses, predator/prey and other relationships between aquatic plant and animal life. Learn not just what fish and animals are, but how they interact with each other and the environment.

The Fun Part

Learn about why some creatures behave the way they do and what their role is in the aquatic ecosystem.

What You Learn

You learn about

The major aquatic life groupings, interactions and factual information that dispels negative myths.

The role of aquatic plants, food chains and predator prey relationships

Responsible interactions with aquatic life

The underwater naturalist's view of organisms and their roles in the environment

You put this information into practice during your two open water dives.



Prerequisites

Must be a PADI Open Water Diver or Junior Open Water Diver (or qualifying certification from another organization)

Duration

The *Naturalist Diver Specialty Course* consists of maximum 2 dives / 1 dive if your instructor credits you the Adventure Naturalist dive

PADI NIGHT DIVER COURSE

As the sun sets, you don your dive gear, slip on your scuba mask and bite down on your dive regulator. A deep breath and you step off the boat – into the underwater night. Although you've seen this reef many times before, this time you drop into a whole new world and watch it come to life under the glow of your dive light.

The Fun Part

Introduce yourself to the whole new cast of critters that comes out after the sun goes down. See your favorite dive sites from a whole new perspective at night.

What You Learn

Learn about: Night dive planning, organization, procedures, techniques and potential problems How to control your buoyancy at night Entries, exits and underwater navigation at night

Nocturnal aquatic life, since many of the plants and animals you'll see are different

The Scuba Gear You Use

You will use the basic scuba diving equipment with a dive light and glow stick.

You must be a PADI Open Water Diver or Junior Open Water Diver certification (or qualifying certification from another organization). At least 12 years old.

The *Night Diver Specialty Course* consists of maximum 3 dives / 2 dives if your instructor credits you the Adventure Night dive

Prerequisites

Be 15 years or older

Have a PADI Advanced Open Water certification (or have a qualifying certification from another organization)

Be trained and current for first aid and CPR within the previous two years (Ask at the counter about the Emergency First Response CPR and first aid courses).

Duration

The Rescue Diver Course takes 3 days

PADI Divemaster Course

Looking for the first step in working with scuba as a career?

Your adventure into the professional levels of recreational scuba diving begins with the PADI Divemaster program. Working closely with a PADI Instructor, in this program you expand your dive knowledge and hone your skills to the professional level. PADI Divemaster training develops your leadership abilities, qualifying you to supervise dive activities and assist instructors with student divers. PADI Divemaster is the prerequisite certification for both the PADI Ass. Instructor and PADI Open Water Scuba Instructor certifications.



What You Learn

During the PADI Divemaster program, you learn dive leadership skills through both classroom and independent study. You complete water skills and stamina exercises, as well as training exercises that stretch your ability to organize and solve problems as well as help others improve their scuba. You put this knowledge into action through a structured internship.

Prerequisites

To take this course, you must be:

18 years old

A PADI Advanced Open Water Diver (or qualifying certification from another training organization) A PADI Rescue Diver (or qualifying certification from another training organization)

An EFR (or qualifying first aid and CPR training from another organization) course completion within the past 24 months.

Have at least 20 dives to begin the course and 60 for certification

Be fit for diving and submit a Medical Statement signed by a physician within the last 12 months.

Duration and pricing

The Divemaster Course at Reef 2000 is done the internship way and takes between 3 to 4 weeks

<u>CPR and First Aid: Emergency First Response</u> <u>Primary and Secondary Care</u>

First aid and CPR are good skills for anyone involved in adventure sports – just in case. And, you need these skills for the PADI Rescue Diver course.

Emergency First Response is a PADI affiliate that specializes in teaching these lifesaving skills – and they're for anyone, not just divers. Most PADI Instructors are also Emergency First Response Instructors!

The Fun Part

The fun part about Emergency First Response training is learning serious medical emergency response skills in an upbeat, positive environment. You gain the confidence that you are prepared to help in an emergency.

What You Learn in the EFR Primary and Secondary Care Courses

- BLS (Basic Life Support) CPR and rescue breathing at the layperson level
- AED (automated external defibrillator) use (optional)
- Preventing and caring for shock
- Spinal injury management
- Use of barriers to reduce disease transmission risk
- Basic first aid and first aid kit considerations

The Learning Materials You Need

The Primary and Secondary Care Manual and video on DVD preview emergency scenarios and provide step-by-step skill demonstrations. Has it been a while since you've been scuba diving?

Do you feel like your scuba skills and knowledge are a bit rusty? The Check Dive / Refresher Dive is just what you need. It reacquaints you with diving so that you're back to feeling comfortable in the underwater world in less than a day.

The Fun Part

Brush up on your scuba knowledge and skills. Improve your diving ability, and get used to the Red Sea as a diving enviroment



What You Learn

You will go over scuba knowledge you learned during your initial training. Then, practice fundamental skills in a confined water area (in the Red Sea!).

You will review:

Safe diving practices, dive planning fundamentals, problem management, breathing air at depth, recreational diving and dive tables: basic knowledge

recreational diving and dive tables: dive planning

After you complete the knowledge assessment, you will go through main diving skills in a save and easy environment. You review information about each skill, why it's important, points to remember when performing the skill.

The Check Dive is particularly beneficial if you:

Are a PADI Open Water Diver course referral student who wants a refresher prior to making your open water training dives

Are a PADI Scuba Diver who wants to upgrade to PADI OPEN WATER DIVER

or you just haven't scuba dived in a while and want to get acclimated again.

(if you last logged dive is more than 6 month ago we will ask you to enroll in a Check Dive)

The **Refresher Dive** is particularly beneficial if there are still skills to work on after the half day check dive or you feel you want to gain some more experience before joining the normal guided dives or you have not dived for long period of time and there more refreshing to do. *(the decision if you need a Refresher Dive will be done after the Check Dive)*

Prerequisites

To take the Check Dive or Refresher Dive you must: Have a scuba certification or be enrolled in a scuba certification course Be at least 10 years old

Duration and pricing

The **Check Dive** takes half a day and consists of 1 Theory session, 1 skill session with 1 dive attached to it.

If you are using 1 dive from your dive package the supplement is 15 Euro (tanks & weights)

The *Refresher Dive* takes a day and consists of 2 Theory session, 2 skill sessions with 2 dives attached to it.

If you are using 2 dive from your dive package the supplement is 35 Euro (tanks & weights)

<u>BOAT SAFARI</u>

Every Wednesday we run a local boat safari to the remote untouched areas south of Dahab.

There only a few dive boat in Dahab, which ensures for uncrowded diving on the southern virgin reefs of Gabr El Bint and Shahira.

Although Dahab is predominantly a shore diving resort, Reef 2000 charters the Ghazallah VI dive boat and runs once a week trips down to the unspoilt reefs of Gabr EI Bint, that lie to the south of Dahab and can be only reached by boat or camel.

It is always a great day out, and always a spectacular day of diving.

Included in the price are 2 dives (tanks & weights), lunch and unlimited soft drinks.





Pricing

If you have already bought a dive package, the supplement is 60 Euro

Floh has been a professional diver since 1997 and has been one of Dahab's first Technical Divers (still unbent). Benefit from more 10 years experience in Technical Diving. Must be qualified as an IANTD EANx Diver and IANTD Deep Diver with proof of a minimum of (we think) 100 logged dives or sufficient experience to satisfy the instructor that the student has the ability and knowledge to continue into this level of training.

Must be a minimum of 15 years of age with a parent or guardian authorization, or a minimum of 18 years of age without guardian approval.

_ Advanced Recreational Trimix Diver

This program is designed to extend the divers knowledge with recreational Trimix mixtures mixes starting from and Oxygen content of 24% and up to 100% for decompression. The maximum END (Equivalent Narcotic Depyt will be 24 msw. It further develops diving skills and provides a greater understanding of the Nitrox / Trimix diving concept. This program qualifies divers to do dive to 48 msw and do decompression stops required dives up to 15 minutes. The maximum END (Equivalent Narcotic Depyt will be 24 msw.



Prerequisites:

Must be qualified as an IANTD EANx Diver and IANTD Deep Diver with proof of a minimum of (we think) 100 logged dives or sufficient experience to satisfy the instructor that the student has the ability and knowledge to continue into this level of training.

- **Technical Diver** (equivalent of TDI Extended Range Diver)

This Program is designed to train divers to conduct dives to depths between 100 fsw (30 msw) and at the instructors option up to 170 fsw (51 msw) using custom blend breathing gas mixtures; and to provide greater understanding of custom blend breathing gas mixtures, a complete knowledge of the limits of any EANx mixture, and the use of EANx and oxygen for decompression.

The knowledge and skills taught in this program are more than adequate to qualify divers to perform Dives outside of training up to 180 fsw (54 msw)

Must be qualified as an IANTD Advanced EANx Diver.

The knowledge and skills taught in this program are more than adequate to qualify divers to perform Trimix Dives outside of training up to 333 fsw (100 msw).
