### **Why Dive with White Beach Divers?**

They know the dive sites intimately, where the best marine life is, the nicest corals and the hidden gems. Our guides are able to show you the best that Boracay has to offer from shallow hard coral reefs to deep walls with strong currents, Boracay has something to offer all divers, no matter what the level of your experience or training.

White Beach Divers is perfectly located right in the centre of the local dive sites, most dive sites are only 10 to 15 minutes away and only 30 minutes to the most distant in either direction. Short journey times mean more time in the water and less time on the boat. And allow us to return to the dive centre between most dives. This enables us to accommodate more individual diving needs that suit our customers wishes. We operate several daily schedules departing from the beach directly in front of the dive centre, “no long walks to the boat stations”. using several boats including a small rubber Zodiac, an aluminium speed boat and the traditional Philippine style Banka Boat.

Our dive guides speak several major languages including, English, German, French, Russian and Chinese, so good communication is never a problem. All are friendly and give that little bit extra to make customers experiences extra special.

No need to carry that heavy dive kit with you, we have everything you need in rental equipment including Bcd's, regulators, long and shorty wetsuits available in sizes from XXL to XXS, cameras, torches, and computers.

### **The Main Dive Sites**

#### **Angol Point**

FACT FILE Depth: - 4 – 20m, Ability Level: All, Travel Time: 5 minutes

A shallow site excellent for beginners, and a relaxing dive for the more experienced and for photographers. There are several big coral heads rising up from the reef, with plenty of fish and interesting macro finds. Swarms of anthias and damsels, butterfly fish, lion fish, blue ribbon eels, morays and nudibranchs can all be found. This site has many anemones, where you can see the beautiful 'Nemo' clown fish as well as porcelain crabs and commensal

shrimps. A lovely introduction for Discover Scuba Diving participants.

### ***Coral Garden***

FACT FILE Depth: - 4 – 20m, Ability Level: All, Travel Time: 5 minutes

A genuine garden of coral this large shallow site excellent for beginners, and a relaxing dive for the more experienced and for photographers. There are several big coral heads rising up from the reef, with plenty of fish and interesting macro finds. The site gently slopes to around 16m with pure white sand and coral garden patches, Juvenile yellow fin barracuda can be seen circling in schools whilst swarms of anthias and damsels, butterfly fish, lion fish, blue ribbon eels, morays and nudibranchs can all be found. This site has many anemones, where you can see the beautiful tomato clown fish as well as porcelain crabs and commensal shrimps. A lovely introduction for Discover Scuba Diving participants.

### ***Fridays Rock***

FACT FILE 12-18m, Ability Level All, Travel Time 15 minutes

A large rock rising from 16m to about 8m with plentiful marine life can be found on the rock itself and the sandy and patch reefs in the surrounding area. Especially over the top of the rock where spectacular fish displays can be witnessed. Large bass, Snapper, Schools of Surgeon Fish, Angel Fish, Fusiliers and a large number of Damsels swirl around. Trigger Fish, scorpion and Lion Fish are also common to the reef.. This is also a good place to spot large Grouper, Napoleon Wrasse and Turtles. Don't neglect the crevices of the rock and outer reefs where Mantis Shrimp and Octopus may be found.

### ***Ballinghai***

FACT FILE Depth: 10 – 25m, Ability Level: All, Travel Time: 20 minutes

This site has varied topography starting with a reef plateau at around 12m with anemones and morays, then dropping off to a wall down to 18m. At the base of the wall there are beautiful patches of coral and an artificial reef which is now well inhabited with fish and critters. Interesting hard coral 'tree' formations and barrel sponges alongside the reef balls make for a fascinating landscape. Snapper, lion fish and even the wonderful clown trigger fish can be observed, as well as abundant macro life such as ribbon eel and nudis.

### ***Santos Place***

FACT FILE Depth: 10 – 20m, Ability Level: All, Travel Time: 20 minutes

when dropping over the beginning of the wall, numerous red-tooth triggerfish are usually seen. Along the wall itself, which drops off to around 20m, you can see emperors, groupers, eels and boxfish. There are also a number of outer patch reefs slightly away from the wall on the sand, and spending the time to head out to these areas can reward you with sightings of blue-spotted stingrays and free-swimming lionfish. Mantas and other larger rays, as well as hawksbill turtles, have occasionally made an appearance here.

## **Crocodile Island**

FACT FILE Depth: 5 – 22m, Ability Level: All, Travel Time: 20 minutes

One of the top dive sites on Boracay and very popular with all levels of diver. Very healthy sloping coral reef with plenty of both soft and hard corals. A massive variety of macro life with different types of nudibranch, anemones and the full range of fish life simply covering the area. This site is described as beautiful by divers, with lion fish, angel fish, butterfly fish, box fish, scorpion fish, sweetlips, pipe fish, eels and even the occasional sea snake. Also an excellent choice for a night dive when the current is right.

## **Laural Valley**

FACT FILE Depth: 5 - 18m Ability Level: Medium, Travel Time: 20 minutes

This dive starts at just 5m with a delightful swim-through where colourful pink, orange and yellow corals and purple dragon nudibranchs can be found. Then you move on to a sloping coral reef where you often find unusual critters not seen on many other dives. Various eels, nudibranchs and a wide range of clownfish make their home here, as well as cowfish and cuttlefish at the base of the reef. This dive is also possible for beginners on the right tide, but usually there is some current so part of the dive involves a drift.

## **Laural Wall**

FACT FILE Depth: 8 – 22m, Ability Level: All, Travel Time: 25 minutes

This is a beautiful wall dive with a lovely coverage of feather stars, sponges and healthy coral varieties, especially table and soft corals. Any different types of nudibranch can be found here and this site is great as a dive for macro photographers. The fish population varies with the currents blue ribbon eels, morays, lionfish, scorpionfish, boxfish and many more make their home on this reef. Also take a close look at the gorgonian sea fans and see if you can spot the tiny and rather shy pygmy seahorses.

## **Camia 2**

FACT FILE Depth: 24 – 30m, Ability Level: Advanced Open Water (or as a Wreck Adventure Dive) Travel Time: 12 minutes

The wreck of a cargo ship purposely sunk on 8 January 2001, has become overgrown and inhabited with a large variety of marine life. On the sand at 29m, garden eels and ribbon eels can be found, as well as pygmy seahorses and ghost pipefish a short way from the wreck on the coral bed. The wreck itself, sitting in an upright position and intact, is home to lionfish, snapper, grouper, boxfish, batfish and many others. The engine room is often filled with copper sweepers, while the masts are covered in interesting macro life. One of the best wreck dives in the Philippines

## **Tribird**

FACT FILE Depth: 22 – 30m, Ability Level: Advanced Open Water (or as a Wreck Adventure Dive) Travel Time: 10 minutes

The Tribird is a 21 meter long 3- engined Jet aeroplane with a 25 meter wing span and passenger capacity of 36 that was sunk on 1st March 2012. Already a large family of colourful squid and shrimp have made this their home. The wreck sits up-side down with the nose on the deeper part of the gentle slope. Beyond the wreck, the reef drops off as a steep wall with the possibility of larger marine life coming up from the deep. For those who want to take a look inside, White Beach Divers can undertake Wreck Speciality training on request.

### **Punta Bunga**

FACT FILE Depth: 30m- 70m, Ability Level: experienced divers only, Travel Time: 25 minutes

From a sandy slop the wall starts at around 30m and can be dived on both a rising or falling tide, Eagle rays and White tip sharks are the order of the day here with red tooth trigger, banner and butterfly fish, many large fish make regular appearances

### **Virgin Drop**

FACT FILE Depth: 30m +, Ability Level: experienced divers only, Travel Time: 12 minutes

A steeply sloping reef with two drop off's, the first from around 29m to 45m and the second dropping to around 70m. Schools of butterflyfish and banner fish can be seen in large numbers, with nudibranchs and moray eels plentiful. This is a good dive site for those wanting to take the deep diver speciality course

### **Yapak 1**

FACT FILE Depth: 30m +, Ability Level: experienced divers only, Travel Time: 30 minutes

An exhilarating deep wall, drift dived on a falling tide, with the opportunity to see larger marine life. After a negative entry, descend down towards the wall and enjoy red-tooth triggerfish and Butterflyfish swirl around you. The wall begins just below 30m and drops off sharply, to around 80m half way along the wall is an opening on the plateau where you can drop down a wide hole and exit at around 42m on the wall . Regular sightings of grey reef and white tip sharks. Jacks, tuna, snapper and eagle rays, with sweetlips, triggerfish and barracuda swimming around on the edge of the wall in the current.

### **Yapak 2**

FACT FILE Depth: 32m +, Ability Level: experienced divers only, Travel Time: 30 minutes

An exhilarating deep wall, drift dived on a rising tide, with the opportunity to see the larger marine life of Boracay. After a negative entry, descend down towards the wall and enjoy red-tooth triggerfish swirl around you. The wall begins just below 30m and drops off sharply, to around 100m and the whole area is teeming with fish, including grey reef and white tip sharks. Jacks, tuna, snapper, sweetlips, triggerfish and barracuda swim around on the edge of the wall in the current. Sharks can sometimes be found sleeping in the crack on the wall plateau. and occasional Manta, Devil and Marble rays can be seen

### **Tulobhan Reef**

FACT FILE Depth: 11- 20m, Ability Level: All, Travel Time: 35 minutes

Popular with all levels, this is a gentle dive on a sloping reef with abundant feather stars and plenty of both hard and soft corals. There is a wide variety of macro life, including many nudibranchs, eels and anemones with their clownfish, shrimps and crabs. butterflyfish, pufferfish and lionfish inhabit the area. At the base of the reef, is a sandy bottom with scattered corals. This site is perfect in windy weather since it is well sheltered and can be accessed directly from the east side of the Island

### **Laguna de Boracay**

FACT FILE Depth 3 – 12m, Ability level; ALL, Travel Time 35 minutes

Calm, sheltered with hard and soft corals, this dive site starts with an easy shallow entry making it perfect for inexperienced divers and beginners.

### **Malabunot**

FACT FILE Depth: 10- 20m, Ability Level: All, Travel Time: 30 minutes

Popular with all levels, this is a gentle dive on a healthy reef with abundant feather stars and plenty of both hard and soft corals. There is a wide variety of macro life, including many nudibranchs, eels and anemones with their clownfish, shrimps and crabs. butterflyfish, pufferfish, lionfish and colourful cuttlefish inhabit the area. At the base of the reef, colonies of garden eels live in the sandy bottom. Sea snakes and the occasional turtle may also be seen. This site is perfect in windy weather since it is well sheltered and can be accessed directly from the east side of the Island

### **Tambisaan Reef**

FACT FILE Depth: 4 - 8m, Ability Level: All Especially good for Discover Scuba Divers, Travel Time: 25 minutes

This Shallow dive site with hard corals is especially good for first time divers or those with limited experience, Calm and sheltered from June to October this is an ideal introduction dive site. Damsels, wrasse, clown fish, parrot and butterfly fish as well as many nudibranchs and star fish.

### **Beach Night Dive**

FACT FILE Depth: -3-6m, Ability Level: All with night dive experience or as a Night Adventure Dive, Travel Time: None

This shallow shore dive can be spectacular at night. Even before arriving at the reef, the snake eels in the sand provide amusement. on the patch reef, there are a huge variety of shrimp and unusual crabs. octopus and even seahorses can be found in this area. Cuttlefish often swim by and their colours shimmer with the torch light. Lionfish may be seen hunting and parrotfish sleep in their night-time bubble. Also enjoy the bioluminescent 'fireworks' by putting your torch to your chest and swishing the water with your hand.

### **Channel Steps Drift**

FACT FILE Depth: 15 - 37m Ability Level: Medium Travel Time: 15 minutes

This is a thrilling drift dive with fast current that runs through the channel between the islands of Boracay and Panay. The topography is multiple stair-like drop-offs, hence the name Channel Steps. Gorgonian fan corals, whips and barrel sponges are everywhere on the bottom, along with some rock boulders that give shelter to sweetlips and groupers. On the steps at around 30 meters are some small cave-like outcroppings where whitetip reef sharks and rays often rest. This dive is a lot of fun, so zoom along and enjoy the ride!

## How to get to here?

Getting to Boracay is easy, you can fly to either Cataclan or Kalibo International airport with both domestic and international connections. Many ferries arrive from several parts of the Philippines in Cataclan. Then its a quick 10 minute boat across to Boracay. Once in Boracay ask your trike driver to take you to White Beach Divers in Angol, opposite Tree House, Station 3
