Time Zone: GMT +9

Climate: Tropica I Climate w th an annual mean te mperature of 27°C (82°F). Rain is frequent betw en the months of July and October. Howeve r, Palau is not referre d to the Lan d of Rainbows for not hing. Periodic flash rain showers are freque nt througho ut the yea r. **Water Temperature,** like most tropical countries, varies betw een 27°C a nd 29°C (8 1°F to 84°F) with thermocline s due to the ocean tre nches that surround Palau.

Currency is in US dollars. Credit cards are widely ccepted in Palau (exc ept AMEX and Diners). Solitude One als o accepts **credit card** (Visa/Master Only, Applicable Facility Fee) to accept payments on bo rd for any incidentals incurred d uring your stay. Please inform the cruise directors at least one night before your disembark ation that you would like to pay hese expen ses with a credit card.

On la nd, **electric ity and plu g sockets** are the same as in the U SA (Single p hase 60 cycles, 115/2 30 volts AC). However, universal sockets (EU, USA, A US, UK, CN, etc) are used on board Solitude One in cluding USB charging outlets (1Amp) – s ee image.

Duty-Free Allowance – 1 lit re of alcoho I and no more than 20 sticks of cigarettes or 170g (6 o unces) of tobacco. No fre sh or thawed food (su ch as fruit, meat, vege tables or sea food) is all owed to be brought into Palau. Y ou might be charge d with a fee for such it ems to be

dispo sed of if yo u are found to have them with you when you e nter Palau.



Postal service is provided by USPS (United States Postal Services). All postages originating from the US to Palau are considered lo cal service. State code for Palau is PW and the zip code is 96940. If you are planning to send something to Solitude, p lease go to the <u>contac t us</u> <u>page</u> for our delivery addres s.

What Do I Need To Pay On Board?

Your cruise package essentially excludes Equipment Rentals, Satellite Communications, EANitrox, Alcohol, Laundry Service, Marine Park Fees and Local district administration permits. Marine Park Fees and Local Barangay permits will be collected on check-in. You will pay the other incidental expenses at check-out. Here is the list of what you need to pay for your trip in Palau (data as of 30 January 2018):

- State Cabin/Room Tax of 10USD per Day (i.e. 8D7N = 80USD, 11D10N = 110USD) (Definitely, pay on board at welcome briefing)
- Peleliu Diving Permit 30USD (Ages 6 or older) + Koror Diving Permit (Ages 7 or older)
 50USD = 80USD (pay on board at welcome briefing. You can use an existing permit if it is still valid till the last day of your itinerary)
- Jelly Fish Lake and Rock Island Permit = 50USD (only if you want to go on this tour. May be closed to Public at the time of your visit)
- Palau Departure Airport or Seaport Tax = 50USD (For Air Tickets purchased before 2018 -Pay on your departure) or 100USD (For Air Tickets purchased from 2018 which will then be priced into your Ticket)

Do we have WIFI? Do you have internet? Yes We Do!

Solitude One provides internet access on board via Satellite using VSAT Services. To access the internet, our guests may pre-purchase data packages and log in via our WIFI Network Hotspot on board.



Available Data Packages are USD20/100Mb, USD40/300Mb, 70USD/200mb and 100USD/300Mb.

You are strongly recommended to manage your device settings (our crew will be able to assist) whilst using satellite internet to ensure that you do not waste precious data traffic, as you can already expect that the charges for satellite internet are significantly costlier than what you would be accustomed to paying for the internet.

Tips on using satellite internet with your devices

Keep your messages short. Use short hand, or acronyms. A longer message means more data.

Disable Auto-Updates, Auto Sync on your devices.

If your device has such a setting, mark our on board WIFI SSID as metered (or similarly referred to as metered so that your device knows that although you are on WIFI, your data is precious and limited)

Please note that the satellite communications are an additional facility provided by an external source. Solitude is not responsible for any consequences resulting from the use or the lack of use of satellite communications including hardware failure.

As connectivity can be affected by weather and is also reliant on a 3rd party service provider (VSAT K-Band), Solitude One, her crew and management are NOT responsible for any inconveniences and/or loss of income, data or information which may arise due to the lack of the service, partially or completely.

Phone Calls, SMS and Emails

When out of local mobile signal coverage, Solitude One's onboard VSAT satellite communication system will be your only option if the need to make or receive calls is urgently required.

Guests will be charged for all incoming/outgoing calls and messages: US \$3 per 60 seconds block.

Buy a Local Sim Card? Yes, You Can



Yes, you can. We do not sell them on board. You will need to purchase in person in Koror as you will need to register your particulars on purchase. However, even with the recent 3G/4G introduction, you still need to have proper mobile signal for the connectivity.

Currently, Palau does not have support for international roaming except Philippines, China, USA and Taiwan (to the best of our knowledge).

As mentioned, Palau's remoteness also makes voice calls much costlier than usual which is the reason why most people in Palau opt to use SMS instead. Making overseas calls from your local Palau number is also very costly. Entertainment

Our WIFI SSID on board is also used for our media entertainment library (Powered by PLEX Media Server) from which you will be able to stream/download what we have in our library to watch/listen to. Install



PLEX app (RECOMMENDED: Android, Windows or IOs) or <u>any popular UPNP media player</u> app that will read/discover DLNA devices and you are all set!

Do you have Nitrox? Yes, We Do!

Although the standard mix for EAN is 32%, on most dives we have made an educated decision to provide in the proximity of EAN30 instead, to allow a safer M.O.D. EAN 30% would provide some degree of depth buffer if you are caught especially in a down current, but will still allow ample extended length of



bottom time (compared to normal air). EANitrox prices are as follows: US \$8 per dive OR US \$135 for 8 days/7 nights Palau itinerary, with subsequent additional use US \$20 per day.

DIN or International? We have both.

15L/100cuft Scuba Cylinders?

Yes we have. It is an additional US \$8 per cylinder per diving day.

Side-mount Diving?

Additional 12L/80cuft cylinder with air: US \$10 per cylinder per diving day Additional 12L/80cuft cylinder with EANitrox: US \$28 per cylinder per diving day. Whole Trip Use discount of 10% applies.

Rebreather Diving? Twins?

Yes, we do support Rebreather Diving but we do not have Twin-Tanks. Our support is only on oxygen filling (US \$0.06 per litre) with a booster pump on board. Your dive profile must also follow with the other recreational divers in consideration for other guests' comfort and safety. Complete support (including Twin Tank configurations) can be accommodated for full charters. For full charters, profiles are of course not limited to our standard recreational limits. Do note that the price of helium, if required, can be costly.

How to get t o Palau

Being re mote with small population (un der 25,000) and tourist arrivals av eraging between 140,000 to 160,000, Palau doe s not have daily flight service fro one major airport. T hat said, with 5 G ateways to Palau, there are enou gh options to consider depending on where you travel from. The 5 (major) gateways a re Manila, Taipei, Narita, Guam a nd Seoul and their sch edules (gateway to Palau s ector) as of October 2 016 are:-

Manila U nited Airlin es - Every Tuesdays and Fridays

Taipei C hina Airlines – Every W ednesday and Saturda ys

Narita Delta Airline s - No-Stops Every Tue sdays and Saturdays a nd United Airlines – One-Stop (Guam). Refer to Gu am.

Guam U nited Airlin es – Every d ay EXCEPT Saturday. USA Visa is required ev en on tran

sit. Seoul Asiana and Ko rean Air – Thursdays and Sundays

Travelling to Palau – Special Mentio n: Manila Airport

Updated on 19 Dec 2 17

On our w eb page we listed the various ways to get to Palau, we now share with you so me tips to prepare yourselves to have a s moother journey, espe cially whe transiting through Manila.

The Nino y Aquino I ternational Airport is the most c hallenging a irport to transit. Unlike most international airports, ease of moving between terminals is non-existent in Manila. The flight to Palau fro m Manila with United Airlines lea ves from Terminal 1. You are enc ouraged to choose an airline th at arrives i nto Manila at Terminal 1 if Manil is your choice to transit to get to Palau.

If you find yourself arriving in terminal 2 or 3, assuming there are no delays in your arrival, you MUST le ave yourself at least 3 hours (4 if possible) of transit time (the traffic in Manila is really special). Also, you will have NO alternative but to collect your luggage and go through immigra ion/custom s. There are two way s to get to T erminal 1:

- <u>RECOMMEN DED</u> The e is a NEW service call the Termi nal Transfe r Service (Bus). Please as k for directions if you do not see the sign to w here you should go to take that transfer bus which is free of c harge. This bus though not a short frequent service (30 mins in terval) is y our best wa y to get to your terminal. Do queue because t he bus is lim ited space missing one will mean a 30 minutes wait. M ake sure you ask the warden or bus driver to ensure that you are getting on th e right bus.
- 2. Taxi. Look for the yello w taxi (met ered & airp ort accredited) counter and infor m the c ounter staf f that you are going to Terminal 1. Terminal 3 is the furthest from erminal 1

and, depending on traffic; it can take you bet ween 60mi ns to 90min s (for what should be a 30minute drive). Term inal 2 is the closest b ut can also ake 30mins to 60mins due to tr affic.

Depending on traffic and which termin al you are travelling fr om, your t axi fares c an vary (yellow taxi m eters are a l ittle more expensive than the reg ular white taxis) but generally it s hould not be more th an 250PHP - make sur they have their meter ON! If y ou are trav elling in gro ups, be pre pared to only fit 2 of ou in one t axi with your luggage.

If you are arriving i nto Termin al 1,

- 1. do give yourself at least 2 hours of transit time
- 2. do go to the transfer de sk on your arrival and inform them that you are transiting. Once y ou do that, there is a chance you do not need to go thro ugh immigration and customs in M anila, they will assist you to colle ct your bag s at the arrival baggag e carousel and check y ou in for your flight to Palau at the transfer d esk.

If you don't find yourself in this for tunate situation, you will then ne ed to proc eed to cl ear immigration (writ e "transit" on your im migration fo rm), collect your baggage, go t hrough cust oms, head to the dep arture hall on the top floor and go through t he usual c heck-in process.

Customs – Transiting in Man ila

If the cus toms auth ority for an y reason w ant to impose "import ation" tax o n you for bringing any item that you are g ing to Palau with, do insist to the m that you are only transiting, yo u will need to show them your outbo und ticket. If they som ehow make it difficult for you, just inform the cust ms that you can leave it with the m in their office and collect it bac k when yo u come back into the departure conco urse.

Checking In (Manila Airport)

Have yo r outbound ticket from Palau and Philippine s ready. For som reason (I hope), check-in proced ure in Manila (and in Palau) loves to ask for you to s how your outbound ti ket. On Palau side when leaving Palau to transit in Manila, they will even ask you for th outbound flight of the Philippin es. Have all your tickets printed for your o wn conveni ence.



Do not be shy to sta nd in the queue even before the counters a e opened for check-in. Queues will start to form as early as 45mins befor e the counters are scheduled to o pen (Same as the other airlines in Terminal 1). Yo u'd be bet ter off waiting in the departure concourse with a drink then sta nding in a very long line waiting t o check in. Please note that there are no rest rooms in the departure chec -in hall (th ere are 2 o utside of the departur check in hall but you will need to re-enter the hall via the sec rity checks again).

United Airlines chec k-in is very strict with a weight li mit of 50lbs/23kg per b ag, so pac your bags right the first time! The hand I ggage poli cy is a little more generous with the weight. Do make sure you get the most current information prior to yo ur departure with the airline.

Airline/airport secu rity in Manila can som etimes mak e things difficult when it comes to checkin/hand luggage ite ms. Ensure that you review United Airlines' p olicies and in fact, ha e a printed c opy to sho w proof tha t you have checked a d your ite ms are not r estricted. F rom hearing our guests' experiences, common items that may bring about a de bate are batteries for recreatio nal drones and scrubb ers for rebreathers. R emember, the liquids, aerosols, tc restrictio ns are in fo rce. If you have bough t duty free liquids, yo u must remember to check it in with your luggage as you will not be allowed to bring it across th e security check when entering the departure conc ourse. We recommend any liquid purchases be made in Manila's duty free shops w hile waiting for your flight to Pala u.

Do go to the boarding gate slightly ahead of the boarding time p rinted on y our boarding pass. There is an additional security check done before yo enter the boarding g ate's waiting room.
